In PE, the children went into their new PE groups and worked together to play outdoor ball games, whilst some children took part in a Yoga session. In literacy, we read the story, The Colour Monster. We looked at all of the different emotions and matched symbols for the different parts of the story. The children then decorated their own colour monsters. Inspired by The Colour Monster, we also started to make our own class sensory bottles for our Zones of Regulation. Some children explored the sensory room for the first time and we hope to make this a regular visit to coincide with our Welly Walk on Wednesday afternoons.
