Class Hugo enjoyed a great second week back exploring the nursery rhyme, Row Row Row Your Boat. The children had lots of fun immersing themselves in the rhyme through hand puppets and toys for the animal characters and the corresponding sounds ("crocodile scream" was a particular favourite). They built up great anticipation for which animal came next and we had lots of giggles when they interacted with the toys. We made paper plate boats, had fun with the water play and explored the blue dyed rice which the children enjoyed pouring with.

In Maths we compared "small" and "big" using toy animals and had to see which animals would fit in their corresponding sized boxes.

We learnt how Diwali is celebrated and made our own salt dough and paper plate Diya Lamps. We also had a rangoli patterned themed Attention Autism session where we watched the skittles make a wonderful rainbow pattern in the water.
